2. Descripción y objetivos de la materia

This course is a survey course in global studies focusing on the regions of North America and Europe. In this course we examine the geographical, environmental, political, cultural and social aspects of the United States of America and Europe in order to gain an overall understanding of these regions within the context of a globalized world.

1. Understand the basic principles - concepts and processes - involved in the discipline of global studies. 2. Locate economic, political and cultural regions, and physical features of the U.S. and Europe. 3. Gain an appreciation for the diversity within the U.S. and Europe, both in terms of its physical as well as its human elements. 4. Describe religious, linguistic, demographic, economic and political patterns across these two regions and contrast them with other regions of the world. 5. Analyze and evaluate current events in the context of the geographic factors in the region. 6. Improve research, reading, writing and English skills.

Student Learning Outcomes (SLO): First, substantial knowledge of history, society, and culture, as well as a basic appreciation of different scholarly approaches. Second, learning critical thinking skills necessary to analyze a variety of cultural artifacts (literature, primary documents, film, music, etc.), as well as historical and present-day sociopolitical issues. Third, develop competence in scholarly writing and oral communication. And, finally, the student will acquire basic research skills, including advanced research skills in one area of specialization.

Metodología

The first classes have lectures and presentatiois of the basic concepts about USA and Europe (geographic, population and history).

Criterios de Evaluación

Course Evaluation and Assessment: The following is how your grade will be determined for the semester:

A. Midterm Exams: (4.5 points, 9% each); Final Exam (20 points, 40%)

Exams will be based on a combination of materials from the text book, in class lectures, videos and discussions. Exams will be a combination of multiple choice, short answer and essay questions. There will be no make-ups for missed exams or quizzes without proper documentation. Plan to attend the exams on scheduled days.

B. Map Quizzes: (3 points, 6% each)

There will be two map quizzes during the semester. Students will be expected to identify geographic features of the U.S. & Europe including important physical features, countries, states and cities.

C. In-Class Exercises: (1.5 points, 3% each)

There will be several in-class exercises announced during the semester. The topic of the exercise or assignment will relate to the subject matter of the lecture or class. There will be no advanced notice when the exercises will be assigned, so class attendance is crucial for earning this portion of your grade.

D. Writing Assignment: (3 points, 6%)

There will be one take-home writing assignment given out during the semester. The writing portion will be 3-5 pages long. More information will be given out during the semester on these assignments. NOTE: Any instance of plagiarism will result in a failing grade of 0 points on the paper. Plagiarism includes, but is not limited to, downloading text from the internet. Any illustrations (photos, maps, etc.) that your download from the Internet (or borrow from other sources) need to be individually acknowledged.

E. In-class English Interactive Skills: (3 points, 6%)

Your class participation grade will be broken down into several areas – attendance, in-class exercises, class discussions, and your demonstrated engagement in the course.

F. Missed Exams:

The instructor provides students who miss exams for health, religious, or personal reasons the opportunity to do a take home essay exam of eight to twelve pages. If you will be missing an exam you must notify the instructor ahead of the exam and provide a written excuse.
